

MONTHLY TOWN BOARD MEETING
Town of Oneida, Outagamie County
July 8, 2026

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Scott Schaumberg.

Present were: Scott Schaumberg, Al Krause, Terry Hock and Kelly Hill

Also Present: Glen Olson and Cheryl Van Den Berg

Pledge of Allegiance: Led by Chairperson Scott Schaumberg.

Read, correct, and approve the Monthly Town Board Meeting Minutes on June 10, 2026: Terry Hock motioned to approve the Monthly Town Board Meeting Minutes from June 10, 2026, without correction. Al Krause seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Approval of Vouchers: Terry Hock motioned to approve the vouchers numbered 26530 through 26541 and 13 EFT online payments. Al Krause seconded motion. Motion carried.

Outagamie County Sheriff Department- Resident Concerns: No Sheriff present. No resident concerns were noted.

Fire Department Report: Provided by Glen Olson; (10 calls) On 6/12, HWY 54&55; Car vs dump truck. No transport. On 6/14, Rice Rd; Dirt bike accident. 1 transport. On 6/15, Town Rd; Truck took wires and pole down. On 6/30, 3 separate calls at Norbert Hill; Fire false alarm. On 7/1, County Rd EE: Wires arcing in tree over a garage. On 7/7, CTY E; Wire down - cable wire wrapped around powerline. On 7/7, Legacy Ln: Smoke/CO2 alarms going off due to bad battery.

June Training; Mock structure fire involved one engine pumping to a second engine along with air pack crews and ending with a MAYDAY rescue call.

First Responder Report: Provided by County Rescue for June 2026; Total calls = 29 Response Time - 11.7 min. Call breakdown as follows; (4) Breathing Problems, (4) Traffic Accident, (3) Fall Victim, (3) Sick Person, (2) Convulsions/Seizure, (2) Overdose/Poisoning, (2) Stroke/CVA, (2) Unconscious/Fainting, (1) Abdominal Pain, (1) Altered Mental Status, (1) Back Pain, (1) Intoxicated, (1) Medical Alarm, (1) PR (Public Relations), (1) Unknown Problems.

Open Discussion – Limit 3 minutes per person

Resident asked the difference between villages and towns. Town board explained the regulations differ along with the powers they have and how they are governed. Towns are generally more rural with a less concentrated population.

The Town of Oneida and the Oneida Nation's next Cooperative Governance Meeting is late 2026.

Discussion of garbage on Johnson and Ray Rd. Oneida Police discussed with the Town in July regarding the garbage did have personal mailings and Oneida was going to contact the resident. Town Maintenance will evaluate for cleanup.
