

MONTHLY TOWN BOARD MEETING
Town of Oneida, Outagamie County
April 8, 2026

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:02 P.M. by Scott Schaumberg.

Present were: Scott Schaumberg, Al Krause, Terry Hock and Kelly Hill

Also Present: Mike Maass, Ken Olson, Lori Olson, Tana Aguirre, Chris VanBoxtel, Glen Olson and Barb O'Connor Schevers.

Pledge of Allegiance: Led by Chairperson Scott Schaumberg.

Read, correct, and approve the Monthly Town Board Meeting Minutes on March 11, 2026: Al Krause motioned to approve Monthly Town Board Meeting Minutes from March 11, 2026, without correction. Al Krause seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Approval of Vouchers: Terry Hock motioned to approve the vouchers numbered 26460 through 26496 and 11 EFT online payments. Scott Schaumberg seconded motion. Motion carried.

Outagamie County Sheriff Department- Resident Concerns: Deputy Noe was present and reported no current concerns. Resident concerns: Al Krause asked about a possible scam. Deputy Noe stated that if money was given, residents should contact the County and report it. Scott Schaumberg stated that the town reported the reckless driving occurring behind the Town Hall building.

Operator License – Christina Smith: Scott Schaumberg motioned to approve Operator License for Christina Smith. Terry Hock seconded motion. Motion carried.

Fire Department Report: Provided by Fire Chief Glen Olson; (3 calls) On 3/25, Hwy 54 and Hwy H; Two related vehicle accidents involving two vehicles. One person was transported. On 4/2, Ranch Rd; Tree across roadway. On 4/2, Van Boxtel Rd; Trees in power line and burning.

March Training - CPR and First Aid refresher course.

The 2% Dues Audit is scheduled for 4/9/2026. The last audit was completed 3 years ago.

Fire Chief Glen Olson, thanked Hank Olson Construction, Charlie Meltz of Meltz Industries, and Town Maintenance employee Riley Olson for the snow removal assistance during the recent blizzard. Glen summarized the road conditions during the storm, stating that visibility was sometimes less than three feet. He reported that all roads remained accessible for emergency response and that both he and Riley Oldson

monitored 911 calls throughout the storm. He stated they worked hard to ensure milk trucks could access farms and explained that shutting roads down would have created greater issues. Some neighboring townships shut down and experienced significant cleanup afterward.

Chief Olson compared his snow removal experience with the blizzard in April 2018 and felt the 2026 storm conditions were better than the big storm in April 2018. He emphasized that some residents still needed access for work and emergencies, and felt the Town maintained necessary road access.

First Responder Report: Provided by County Rescue for *March* 2026; Total calls = 26 Response Time - 10.5 min. Calls categorized as follows; (4) Fall Victim, (4) Sick Person, (3) Unconscious/Fainting, (2) Abdominal Pain, (2) Breathing Problems, (2) Medical Alarm, (2) Standby for Law Enforcement, (1) Allergies, (1) Assault, (1) Chest Pain, (1) Hemorrhage/Laceration, (1) Strok/CVA, (1) Traffic Accident, (1) Traumatic Injury.

Open Discussion – Limit 3 minutes per person

An update was provided via email from Oneida Nation Representative Melinda, stating she is currently working on drafting a contribution agreement for the future purchase of a fire truck.

Scott Schaumberg asked Tana Aguirre to introduce herself. She stated she is with the Oneida Nation Intergovernmental Affairs Department.

Discussion of dispatch and radio communication concerns;

Brown County and Outagamie County dispatch communication has been an ongoing issue. Departments now require two radios, one for Brown County and one for Outagamie County. There are problems with channels not matching between systems. For example, airport training purposes in the Town of Oneida, departments are issued additional Brown County radios. A few years ago, the Town Fire Department was required to replace radios, which was a large expense and has not improve communications. A new system called “HEBA” allows departments to receive more information prior to calls. This system will hopefully help with delay call for MABAS response.

2026 Road Project Update (Seminary Rd, Old Seymour Rd, portion of Ranch Rd:

Additional culverts are in need of replacement. Outagamie County replaced multiple culverts in Fall 2025 and plans to complete additional culvert replacements this week.

Tana Aguirre stated that the Oneida Nation Financial Committee meeting is upcoming for the release of project funds.

The goal is to begin construction soon, with a temporary break during the Pow Wow to improve public access and navigation. The project is planned for completion by Fall 2026 to avoid conflicts with school transportation and harvest season.

Town Road Weight Limits: The Town follows Outagamie County Highway Department Road weight limits. These limits are scheduled to be removed on Monday, April 13, 2026

Road maintenance requesting attention:

- VanBoxtel Rd- possible culvert review

- Evaluation of right-of-way trees to be trimmed or removed. Glen Olson and Town Supervisor Terry Hock removed trees from the right-of-way before and after the recent ice storm.

- Culvert replacement needed this year; Moore Rd, Fish Creek, McCabe Rd

Adjournment: Terry Hock motioned to adjourn at 7:35 P.M. Al Krause seconded the motion. Motion carried.
