Purpose of Meeting

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the 2026 Road Project involving Seminary Road, Old Seymour Road, and Ranch Road. Representatives from the Town of Oneida, Oneida Nation, and Outagamie County were present to review the anticipated project scope.

Discussion

Outagamie County Highway Department provided an overview of the anticipated scope of work for the project. The work is expected to be completed through the existing Intergovernmental Maintenance Agreement between Oneida Nation and Outagamie County.

The preliminary project scope discussed included roadway gravel lift and reclaim, replacement of two culverts (one on Seminary Road and one at Path of the Wolf), installation of curbing at intersections, milling at bridge and culvert locations, and placement of new asphalt surface. Installation of a double centerline on Seminary Road in the area of the school was also discussed.

Project scheduling considerations were reviewed, including coordination with the school calendar and the annual Powwow event.

Outagamie County representatives indicated that project materials are anticipated to include stone sourced from Northeast Quarry on Pearl Street and asphalt supplied from Murphy's in Seymour.

It was noted that Joe Zellner and the Outagamie County Engineering Department will compile discussion notes from the meeting and will develop an estimated project plan.

Outagamie County Highway Department representatives indicated they will coordinate project communications with Terry Hock (Town of Oneida) and Kyle Skenandore (Oneida Nation) as point of contact.

Discussion also included locations where concrete driveways extend into the public right-of-way. The Town of Oneida noted that a Town ordinance prohibits the placement of concrete within the right-of-way.

Conclusion

This meeting was held for informational and coordination purposes only. No formal action was taken by the Town Board. The meeting concluded at 9:58 AM.
