

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING
TOWN OF ONEIDA, OUTAGAMIE COUNTY
APRIL 19, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Scott Schaumberg

Present were: Scott Schaumberg, Al Krause, Terry Hock and Kelly Hill

Also present: Joe Maass, Anna Froehlich, Glen Olson

Scott Schaumberg led the Pledge of Allegiance

Appointment of Tellers, Sergeants-at-Arms or Parliamentarian. Glen Olson made a motion to pass with no Appointment of Tellers, Sergeants-at-Arms or Parliamentarian. Joe Maass 2nd motion. Motion carried

Glen Olson made motion to dispense reading the made the motion to approve minutes of Annual Meeting April 20, 2021 and Budget Hearing November 10, 2021. Anna Froehlich second the motion. Motion carried.

Joe Maass made a motion to dispense reading the Balance Sheet and Statement of Revenue and Expenditures. Anna Froehlich second the motion. Motion carried. Glen Olson suggested that when budgeting for the upcoming year instead of rolling the Fire Department money into the next year to put the remaining amount into the Capital Credit Union Fire Department account. Glen Olson stated that years ago the Fire Department would do that for the situation when an unexpected expense or large expense that is beyond the annual budget is needed the Fire Department would be able to access and use that account. Glen Olson stated that currently the payments for the new fire truck are being made from that account. The Fire Department built up that account over years of putting remaining budget balance into it. Terry Hock stated that would be a good idea. Scott Schaumberg stated that the Town Board will keep that in mind when budgeting for the upcoming years.

Fire Department Report – Glen Olson summarized the report from the Annual Report. Glen Olson mentioned that they had 68 calls. Glen Olson stated that we had a successful Fireman's Picnic this year with good turnout. Glen Olson also mentioned that the Fire Prevention and Fire Safety Open House was successful with a large group that came from a home-schooling organization.

First Responder Report – Scott Schaumberg stated the EMS report was submitted from County Rescue is in the Annual Report if you'd read over it. Scott Schaumberg stated that they did a nice job of completing the report. Glen Olson was wondering if overdoes were in the report. Scott Schaumberg stated it doesn't categorize that in the report given.

Park Report – Scott Schaumberg stated that the park is open and available to rent this year. Kelly Hill stated that it will be open from Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day. You must be a Town Resident and 21 years of age to rent. Rental cost is \$100.00 per day, with a \$150.00

deposit. The deposit is returned if pavilion and parking area is properly cleaned, no damage and garbage is taken away.

Burning by DNR rules – Scott Schaumberg states that Town of Oneida doesn't give out burning permits, however, if the Town of Oneida and Oneida Fire Department is notified the town will allow small monitored burns.

Old Business – Scott Schaumberg stated that the UTV/ATV Route signs are posted. Scott Schaumberg said that many surrounding towns also have UTV/ATV routes posted including; Seymour, Osborn and city of Shiocton, and Freedom with a designated route.

New Business – Scott Schaumberg stated Town of Oneida ordered a new tractor and mower that is expected to be delivered in July. The order was made early enough and were able to special order it to the town needs. The tractor will have a weighted rear-end and also a Tri-fold ditch mower. Scott Schaumberg stated that once the new tractor and mower is delivered the current New Holland tractor will be sold.

Glen Olson stated that he is hoping the new fire truck will be finished soon. Glen Olson would like to have it by the Annual Fireman's Picnic. Glen Olson said the company is waiting on a supply order to complete the truck. Company is aware of the goal for completion of the truck by picnic.

Scott Schaumberg stated that Fire Department new air packs is on the list of to-do's for next years budgeting.

Scott Schaumberg thanked Town of Oneida, Glen Olson and Chris Vanden Langenberg for their good job of snow plowing.

Scott Schaumberg stated that the Town of Oneida has a new auditor this year, KerberRose, and Scott felt they did a good job so far of assisting with the process. The auditor was able and willing to come and assist the uploading process. Scott Schaumberg stated that with the new clerk and new auditor the process did get delayed somewhat but KerberRose was able to give the town a draft for the annual meeting.

Glen Olson asked about the plowing of the new Ranch Lane. Glen Olson commented that there are no tax payers for town of Oneida on that cul-de-sac. If in the future, homes are built on the new Ranch Lane all the tax paying money would go to Town of Osborn. Glen Olson stated that when plowing a cul-de-sacs you lose 3 miles of road plowing. Scott Schaumberg stated that he would bring it up to Town of Osborn. Scott Schaumberg stated that the Town of Oneida and Town of Osborn do have an inter-government agreement. Scott Schaumberg stated Town of Oneida, Town of Osborn and all the land owners surrounding Ranch Lane were in agreement with new plan of Ranch Lane. No objections. Osborn does have Outagamie County doing their plowing and current Ranch Lane is plowed by Outagamie County. With the new development of

Ranch Lane that will located in Town of Oneida. Scott Schaumberg state that, Brian Schaumberg would potentially be interested in plowing.

Date of 2023 Annual Meeting – Glen Olson made a motion to approve Annual Meeting of next year to the third Tuesday in April which is Tuesday, April 18, 2023. Joe Maass second the motion. All favored, no opposed. Motion carried.
