

MONTHLY TOWN BOARD MEETING
Town of Oneida, Outagamie County
June 10, 2026

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:03 P.M. by Scott Schaumberg.

Outagamie County Sheriff Department- Resident Concerns: Deputy was present and no resident's current concerns were noted.

County Rescue Ambulance Service Agreement: Discussion regarding the agreement included the proposed five-year term and the associated rate increase of approximately 125%. In 2026, the Town paid \$14.69 per capita for ambulance services. Under the agreement, the rate would increase yearly to eventually reach \$46.00 per capita by the end of the five-year term and then percent increase following. The agreement outlines the advanced level of service, coverage, reliability, operational support, and capabilities provided by County Rescue and EAGLE III. The agreement also allows municipalities flexibility to make budget adjustments as needed. The Clerk discussed the budget challenges many townships are facing in providing emergency response services. The Wisconsin Towns Association is aware of these concerns and is exploring potential solutions within the state budget. This issue has become increasingly significant as volunteer emergency service programs continue to decline in many communities. The Clerk noted that, at present, many towns are reallocating funds from other budget areas, including road maintenance, to support emergency response services as it is an essential. Scott Schaumberg motioned to approve the County Rescue Ambulance Service Agreement. Terry Hock seconded motion. Motion carried.

Oneida Nation Fire Truck Contribution Agreement: Discussion and review of the Oneida Nation Fire Truck Contribution Agreement took place. The item was TABLED for further discussion at the Cooperative Governance Agreement Meeting with Oneida Nation.

Fire Department Report: Provided by Glen Olson; (4 calls) On 5/14, Seminary Rd; Dump truck hit a power line. On 6/2, Hanson Rd; Barn fire with a control burn that got away. On 6/3, MABAS call with Hobart; (1) Engine and (5) personnel assisted with a warehouse fire. On 6/6, Hwy EE; Powerline was hanging lower over a road.

May Training; Two tenders and six personnel attended joint training with Hobart at the transfer station. Additional training included a rescue scenario involving a victim pinned beneath a pickup truck.

June Training; One tender and two personnel attended Water Movement Training In Town of Vandenbroek.

The Fire Department Picnic was held on June 7 and was believed to be one of the largest-attended picnics. The event was very successful. Fire Chief Olson thanked the community for its continued support and recognized the volunteers for their efforts in making the event a success.

First Responder Report: Provided by County Rescue for May 2026; Total calls = 26 Response Time - 9.6 min. Calls categorized as follows: (5) Sick Person. (4) Fall Victim. (2) Abdominal Pain. (2) Breathing Problems. (2) Chest Pain. (2) Medical Alarm. (2) Stroke/CVA. (1) Allergies. (1) Assault. (1) Cardiac Arrest. (1) Convulsions/Seizure. (1) No Other Appropriate Choice. (1) Overdose/Poisoning. (1) Traffic Accident.

2026 Road Project Old Seymour Rd, Seminary Rd, and Ranch Rd Update; The project is progressing well and remains ahead of schedule. Outagamie County, the Oneida Nation, and the Town have worked cooperatively throughout the project and have made effective adjustments as needed. Communication from Oneida Nation has been excellent, and the Town expressed satisfaction with the progress and adjustments to the project.

Other Road Updates:

McCabe Road and Vans Road are scheduled for smear patching in 2026.

A culvert replacement is planned on Section Line Road.

Cheryl Vandenberg thanked Town maintenance staff for trimming the brush at the curve of Ray Road. The Town noted that the roadside mower was out of service for a significant portion of last season due to maintenance issues but is currently operating well.
