MONTHLY TOWN BOARD MEETING
Town of Oneida, Outagamie County
May 13, 2026

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:05 P.M. by Scott Schaumberg.

Present were: Scott Schaumberg, Al Krause, Terry Hock and Kelly Hill

Also Present: Jean Olson, Chet Olson, Ken Olson, Lori Olson, and Chris Van Boxtel, and Dennis Scheider.:

Pledge of Allegiance: Chairman Scott Schaumberg indicated the Pledge of Allegiance had been completed during the previous meeting.

Read, correct, and approve the Monthly Town Board Meeting Minutes on April 8 , 2026: Al Krause motioned to approve Monthly Town Board Meeting Minutes from April 8, 2026, without correction. Terry Hock seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Read, correct, and approve the Cooperative Governance Agreement Meeting Minutes with Oneida Nation and Town Board, on April 27, 2026:

Chairman Schaumberg provided a summary of the meeting. Discussion included the status of the 2026 road projects. Outagamie County is completing road work on Old Seymour Road, Seminary Road, and a portion of Ranch Road

under the maintenance agreement with the Oneida Nation. The project is progressing well, and the Town is satisfied with the outcome thus far.

Discussion also included the April flooding event and the need for ditch cleaning. Town did contract out for tree and brush removal for Seminary Rd and Ranch Rd, prior to road construction. Town recognizes concern and need for additional clearing on town roads.

Oneida Nation discussed potential funding for a cul-de-sac at the end of King Lane. The current road is an abrupt dead end. Oneida Nation now has a pump station at the end of the road.

Terry Hock motioned to approve the Cooperative Governance Agreement Meeting Minutes with Oneida Nation and Town Board from April 27, 2026 without correction. Al Krause seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Approval of Vouchers: Terry Hock motioned to approve the vouchers numbered 26497 through 26516 and 15 EFT online payments. Al Krause seconded motion. Motion carried.

Outagamie County Sheriff Department- Resident Concerns: Deputy was present and reported no current concerns in township. Resident noted concern of high speeds on Cty VV between Cty Y and Cty U.

Temporary Class "B" License- Fire Department Picnic June 7, 2026: Al Krause motioned to approve the Temporary Class "B" License- Fire Department Picnic June 1, 2025 Scott Schaumberg seconded motion. Motion carried.

Temporary Class "B" License- Immaculate Conception Parish on August 16, 2026: Al Krause motioned to approve the Temporary Class "B" License- Immaculate Conception Parish on August 16, 2026. Terry Hock seconded motion. Motion carried.

Operator License- Annamarie Maass, Kurt Olson, Chet Olson and Brooke Ellingson: Scott Schaumberg motioned to approve the Operator License- Annamarie Maass, Kurt Olson, Chet Olson and Brooke Ellingson. Al Krause seconded motion. Motion carried.

Culvert Permit - Parcel 170162200 and 170162600:

New landowner David VanDeHey recently replaced two field access driveway culverts with double-walled plastic culverts. This installation does not comply with Town Ordinance Section 11.03(5), as well as the requirement for apron end walls under Ordinance Section 11.03(2).

Chairman Schaumberg stated that while there is no fee for culvert replacement, residents are still required to complete a Culvert Application for verification of requirements. The Chairman also noted that the owner completed a very nice

installation. The owner requested consideration for allowing the double-walled plastic culverts to remain in place.

Chairman Schaumberg stated that approval would require a Town variance vote. He further indicated that if the variance were approved, apron end walls would still be required, and a culvert application with a \$25 fee for each replacement culvert would need to be completed.

The Board discussed concerns regarding future variance requests. Additional concerns included the potential for plastic culverts to buckle if improperly installed. The Board also noted that these are private field access driveways; therefore, if the culverts fail, replacement would be the responsibility of the landowner.

Chairman Schaumberg noted that some plastic culverts and culverts without end walls currently exist within the township; however, those installations predated the ordinance. All new and replacement culverts must comply with current ordinances.

Scott Schaumberg motioned to approve the variance culverts on Bain Rd, parcel 170162200 and 170162600 Terry Hock seconded the motion. Motion carried by a 2-1 vote.

Fire Department Report: Provided by Lieutenant Chet Olson; (2 calls) MABAS call with City of Seymour for a house fire; response included one engine and 12 personnel. Fish Creek Rd wire down call; response included one engine.

Training completed during the past month included confined space and rescue training. The department also participated in joint training with Hobart involving two tenders and five personnel for garbage fire response training.

First Responder Report: Provided by County Rescue for April 2026; Total calls = 29 Response Time - 12.2 min. Call breakdown as follows; (6) Fall Victim, (3) Medical Alarm, (2) Breathing Problems, (2) Chest Pain, (2) Heart Problems, (2) Sick Person, (2) Stoke/CVA, (1) Traumatic Injury, (1) Abdominal Pain, (1) Allergies, (1) Back Pain, (1) Convulsions/Seizure, (1) Hemorrhage/Laceration, (1) Unconscious/Fainting, (1) Unknown Problem, (1) Vomiting.

Open Discussion – Limit 3 minutes per person

Discussion took place regarding the County Rescue Ambulance Service Agreement proposal. The current rate is \$14.69 per capita, which reflected a 2.5% increase from 2025. The proposal for 2027 indicates an increase to \$20.00 per capita. The matter will be placed on next month's agenda for further discussion and possible action.

An update was provided regarding the FEMA application related to the April flooding event. The Town experienced road, culvert and damage within the right-of-way's. The clerk completed the required documentation and restoration information, which was submitted to Outagamie County Emergency Management. The information was subsequently forwarded to FEMA on May 8, 2026. FEMA responded on May 11, 2026, requesting additional documentation and information. The additional information has been submitted.

Discussion occurred regarding April storm damage. Sobiek Farm Services, LLC completed right-of-way clearing work on Seminary Road and Ranch Road prior to the scheduled road project. The Board discussed additional roads in need of clearing of the right-of-way's and prioritizing areas for future contracted work. The town will evaluate Advent Road and Ethel Lane, with location of newly planted trees.

Discussion also occurred regarding the Town of Cicero meeting scheduled for May 14, 2026, which includes an agenda item related to a proposed solar project/data center. Concerns were expressed regarding the amount of farmland being removed from agricultural use for such projects. Additional discussion included concerns that once land is converted to utility use, the property is removed from the local tax roll.

Adjournment: Al Krause motioned to adjourn at 7:56 P.M. Terry Hock seconded the motion. Motion carried.
