TOWN OF ONEIDA, OUTAGAMIE COUNTY  
SEPTEMBER 11, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 P.M. by Scott Schaumberg.

Al Krause made a motion to approve the Monthly Town Board Meeting Minutes from August 14, 2024 without corrections. Terry Hock second the motion. Motion carried

Terry Hock made a motion to approve the vouchers numbered 26027 thru 26068 and 8 EFT online payments. Terry Hock second the motion. Motion carried.

Outagamie County Sheriff Department; No Sheriff present. Resident Concerns; none

Lambie Rd - No Parking Signs. Al Krause made a motion to approve No Parking signs on the east side of Lambie Rd from Town Rd to Fish Creek Rd. Terry Hock second motion. Motion carried.

Fire Department Report provided by Glen Olson and reported by Kelly Hill; (9 calls) CTY EE; Smell of gas. Loose fittings on generator install. CTY E & CTY J; Bike hit by car. 1 transported by ThedaStar. Seminary Rd; Semi truck fuel spill. Town Rd; CO2 alarm. Old detector. Krause Ct; False alarm. CTY EE; Tree took wires down in resident's yard. Oneida Nation High School; False alarm. CTY U & Reformatory Rd; 2 vehicle accident. 3 people transported. Fish Creek Rd; 2 vehicle accidents. No transport.

September Training; Confined space training with escape pack for a situation of going into silos.

September News; Voted on 2 new firefighters; Kyle Jorgenson (previous Jr firefighter) and Tyler Clevon.

First Responder Report provided by County Rescue and reported by Kelly Hill for August 2024; Total calls= 29. Advanced Life Support =15. Basic Life Support =4. Non-transported =10 (29%). Mutual Aid=0. EMRs on-scene=3. Average Response time 11.3 min. Hobart station is a big help.

Open Discussion – Limit 3 minutes per person

Scott Schaumberg discussed residents on Lambie Rd that are concerned about Emergency Response not being able to respond if needed due to large events that are

hosted by a resident on Lambie Rd. vehicles parked on both sides of the roads making it too narrow to be able to get through.

Glen Olson stated that he has noticed that a Lambie Rd resident does hold events often on weekdays, evenings or weekends. As Fire Chief, he is also concerned about Emergency Response and access to a water source near Lambie Rd due to vehicles being parked on both sides of the road.

Al Krause made a motion to adjourn at 7:52 P.M. Terry Hock second the motion. Motion carried.
